1. In reply to reference (a), the following is submitted:

a. Because of the small amount of radioactive material carried at the Naval Supply Depot, Guam, efforts are underway on-island for radiation safety support to be provided by the Naval Ship Repair Facility, Guam, on a reimbursable basis. A letter request has been forwarded to SRF, Guam, for arrangements.

b. A formal radiation safety program will be promulgated and is targeted for full implementation by 30 December 1986.

c. As recommended by Mr. Henry E. Roush, Jr., all radioactive material that could be moved to the mezzanine deck has been relocated. Because of size and weight, some material has been retained in present location, identified, isolated and strictly controlled.

d. After evaluation by Industrial Hygienist, NSD Guam personnel handling radioactive material will be properly identified for inclusion in the medical surveillance program. The evaluation will also determine requirements for wearing personal monitoring devices, if so required. Target completion date for inclusion in medical surveillance program is 30 September 1986.

2. A status report on implementation of paragraph 1.a. above will be submitted by 10 September. A summary of progress in accomplishing all requirements in reference (a) will be forwarded to your office on a quarterly basis.
