Loss of control over the SRF property would unacceptably limit our flexibility to respond to changing political-military circumstances in the Pacific Theater. Furthermore, the SRF compound is located in the very heart of the Navy's Apra Harbor complex, in close proximity to operational units such as SEALs and visiting nuclear submarines. Continued Navy control over the access to and use of this property is vital. Failure to retain control over the site would raise serious security and force protection issues. For these reasons, I strongly recommend that Navy retain title to the former SRF property and cancel the planned transfer.
- 3. This recommendation has been discussed with the political leadership of Guam and is understood by them. I have personally assured Governor Gutierrez and Representative Underwood of my commitment to maintaining a strong Navy presence on Guam, which I firmly believe is in the best long-term interests of all concerned. We have established a Government of Guam Navy Task Force which will explore options that support economic development for the community while preserving Guam's operational and strategic value to our national defense.

- Forwarded, recommending approval.
- 2. The former Ship Repair Facility (SRF) on Guam was recommended for closure by BRAC 95. Operational closure occurred on 30 September 1997. Appropriate assets were transferred to Naval Activities Guam per BRAC 95 recommendations. Additionally, all actions mandated by BRAC 95 have been completed.
- 3. Since 1997, increased geopolitical and military considerations in the region have caused a reassessment of our need for a controlled complex in Apra Harbor. A related concern is the security degradation caused by transferring former SRF property to a private party. Our conclusion is Navy should continue to control Apra Harbor and not transfer the SRF complex and property.
- 4. I concur with ADM Fargo and recommend that Navy retain title to the former SRF and continue to maintain physical control of all associated facilities and real estate.
